Nestled in the heart of the Thracian Valley, under the shadows of seven iconic hills, and divided gracefully by the River Maritsa, Plovdiv is Bulgaria's second-largest city and one of Europe's most captivating destinations. With Roman theatre, ancient streets, and revival-era architecture, this city tells the story of civilizations — from Thracians to Romans, Byzantines to Bulgarians — all still alive in every stone, melody, and glass of wine.

# 2. PARTICIPATION

# 2.1 Registration

To participate in the event, prior registration is required.

Please complete your registration as soon as possible, and no later than 26 September 2025.

- **National participants** should register using the form available on UN Tourism's website: https://www.unwto.org/9-UN-Tourism-Global-Conference-Wine-Tourism

Registrations are subject to approval by the organizers and the host country. Participants will receive a confirmation email once approval is granted and they will be asked to provide information on their travel schedule and accommodation to enable the host to make the necessary

arrangements for local transfers. Should this information remain incomplete once the deadline for registration is reached, organizers reserve the right to cancel registrations.

Due to restricted in-person capacity, limitations as per the number of international participants per organization/entity may apply.

# 2.2 Badges

Participants will be able to collect their identification badges at the venue of the Conference (International Fair Plovdiv) on the following dates and times:

Sunday, 5 October: 15h – 18h
 Monday, 6 October: 08h – 16h

To collect their badges, participants must present a valid ID, or the registration confirmation email.

All participants are requested to wear their identification badges for the duration of the 9th UN Tourism Global Conference on Wine Tourism, as well as during social events.

# 3. ENTRY FORMALITIES

# 3.1 Entry Requirements

To enter the Republic of Bulgaria, all foreign nationals must possess:

- A valid travel document (passport or equivalent), and
- A visa, if required based on nationality and passport type.

#### 3.2 Do You Need a Visa?

- Holders of Diplomatic and Service Passports:
   Check visa requirements for diplomatic and service passports
- Holders of Ordinary Passports (Short Stay up to 90 days):
   Check visa requirements for ordinary passports

### 3.3 Bulgaria and the Schengen Area

- As of 31 March 2024, Bulgaria is part of the Schengen Area, with the abolition of checks at internal air and sea borders, in accordance with Council Decision (EU) 2024/210 of 30 December 2023.
- As of 1 January 2025, checks at internal land borders with and between Bulgaria and Romania have also been lifted, per <u>Council Decision (EU) 2024/3212 of 12 December</u> 2024.

• Bulgaria now issues **uniform Schengen visas**, valid throughout the Schengen Area, from 31 March 2024.

# 3.4 Types of Visas

For short stays related to conference attendance, most participants will require a **Visa Type C** (short stay for the purpose of transit or a planned visit).

# 3.5 Visa Application Requirements

To apply for a Bulgarian visa, applicants must hold a travel document that:

- Is valid for at least 3 months beyond the intended departure date from Bulgaria,
- Contains at least 2 blank pages for visa purposes,
- Has been issued within the last 10 years.

# 3.6 Visa Application Process

- Visas are issued by the diplomatic and consular missions of Bulgaria.
- Applications must be submitted in person or through an authorized agent, no earlier than 3 months before the planned travel date (exceptions apply in humanitarian cases).
- Participants must apply for their visas individually and are fully responsible for ensuring timely submission and follow-up of their application.

#### 4. HOW TO GET TO PLOVDIV

Located in the heart of Bulgaria, Plovdiv is easily accessible by bus, train, car, and air. Whether you are arriving from Sofia, another Bulgarian city, or abroad, getting to the country's cultural and wine capital is smooth and straightforward.

### 4.1 From Abroad – Via Vasil Levski Sofia Airport (SOF)

- Sofia Airport (SOF) is the nearest major international gateway to Plovdiv, offering direct flights from across Europe and beyond.
- Upon arrival, Plovdiv is just a short journey away.

Distance: Approx. 145 km (90 miles)

Travel time: 1.5 to 2.5 hours, depending on the mode of transport

# 4.2 By Bus - Frequent and Affordable

Plovdiv is well connected to Sofia by a reliable and frequent bus network.

- Departure point in Sofia: Central Bus Station (София Централна автогара)
- Arrival point in Plovdiv: South Bus Station (Asmosapa Юг), located near the city center
- Travel time: Approx. 2 hours
- **Frequency:** Every 30–60 minutes
- Ticket price: Around 10–15 BGN (€5–8)

# 4.3 By Train - Scenic and Comfortable

Enjoy the scenic Bulgarian countryside aboard a train from Sofia to Plovdiv.

- Departure station in Sofia: Central Railway Station (Централна гара София)
- Arrival station in Plovdiv: Plovdiv Railway Station (Γαρα Πποεδυε), close to the city center
- Travel time: 2.5 to 3 hours
- Ticket price: From 9 BGN (€4.50)

# 4.4 By Car - Fast and Flexible

For travelers preferring to drive, Plovdiv is a convenient drive from Sofia via the A1 Trakia Highway.

- Estimated drive time: 1.5 hours
- Route: A1 (Trakia) motorway, exit at Plovdiv
- Car rentals: Available at Sofia Airport and in the city center
- Parking: Public lots and designated street zones are available in Plovdiv

### 4.5 Plovdiv Airport (PDV)

Plovdiv also has a regional airport, located about 12 km southeast of the city.

### 5. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

# 4.1 Arrivals

Although Plovdiv has its own airport, we recommend that international participants arrive via Vasil Levski Sofia Airport (SOF), which offers a wider range of international connections.

Complimentary transportation from both Sofia and Plovdiv airports to the official hotels in

Plovdiv will be provided by the host on 4 and 5 October 2025.

Upon arrival at **Sofia or Plovdiv Airport**, local representatives holding signs with the **Conference name** will be present to welcome participants and guide them to their designated transfer.

# **4.2 Departures**

Complimentary departure transfers from the official hotels in Plovdiv to both Vasil Levski Sofia Airport and Plovdiv Airport will be available for participants departing on <u>7 and 8</u> October 2025.

To help organize arrival and departure transfers, international participants are kindly requested to submit their travel details—including flight schedules (arrival and departure) and accommodation information—by <u>26 September 2025</u>.

# 4.3 Transportation during the Conference to the venue and scheduled social events

Local transportation will be provided by the host during the days of the Conference (6 and 7 October), covering transfers from the official hotels to the venue, as well as to the social events and masterclasses taking place at different locations in Plovdiv, in line with the official programme.

#### 8. PRACTICAL INFORMATION

#### 8.1 Weather

The territory of the Municipality of Plovdiv is in the transitional-continental climatic zone. It is characterized by relatively mild winters, but with instability of winter temperatures. Summer is hot, autumn is warm and long, and spring is cool, with frequent frosts. The average annual temperature is 12.2°C, and the average annual amplitude is 23.4°C. On a typical day, the average temperature in Plovdiv in October ranges from a high of 19°C (67°F) to a low of 7°C (46°F), with an average temperature of 14°C (57°F).

### 8.2 Official time

The Republic of Bulgaria is on Greenwich Mean Time (GMT +2)

# 8.3 Official currency

The Bulgarian lev is the official currency of Bulgaria. The currency code for the Bulgarian lev is BGN and its symbol is  $\pi B$ . 1 Euro equals 1.95583 BGN. Banks accept currency exchange, while credit card holders may acquire money from the ATMs of the collaborating banks operating 24 hours. Exchange offices are situated at the airports, official hotels and at Plovdiv city center.

# 8.4 Official language

Bulgaria's official language is Bulgarian. However, English is widely spoken and understood.

# 8.5 Banking Hours

In Bulgaria, banks are open from 09:00 to 17:00 on weekdays.

The city of Plovdiv has ATMs in different parts of the city, and they operate 24 hours a day, with credit and debit cards.

#### 8.6 Electricity

In Bulgaria, power plugs and sockets (outlets) of type F are used. The standard voltage is 230 V at a frequency of 50 Hz. Adaptors and converters may be needed if you are travelling from countries that use 110V or other types of plugs.





### 8.7 Local and international phone calls

For international inbound calls, the country code is +359.

# 9. BRIEF INFORMATION ABOUT BULGARIA

Picturesque nature, hot spring waters, fabulous seaside cities, golden sand beaches, historical treasures, remarkable monasteries, unforgettable mountain views and varied sport activities – Bulgaria is a place where you can immerse yourself and enjoy unique landmarks and places!

Situated between the East and the West, and having favorable climate and natural resources, the country has always been a site of continuous cultural exchange and diversity. Some of the most famous treasures in the world were discovered at the Varna Necropolis, including the world's oldest golden ornaments.

Bulgaria is a country with thousands of years of history and a cultural heritage that embraces ancient civilizations. Despite the fact that it occupies only 2% of the mainland continent of Europe, about 40,000 historical monuments have been registered in Bulgaria.

Wine production in Bulgaria has long tradition. The ancient Thracians, who populated the land in ancient times, worshipped the gods Zagreus and Dionysius and used the wine during their religious rituals.

In the late 19th and early 20th century a professional approach to viticulture and winemaking began to emerge and the foundations of the modern production methods were established for Bulgarian wines. Today, high-quality wines from Bulgaria can be sampled around the globe. Many of the local wine products win international awards and astound foreign oenophiles with their high quality and exquisite taste.

Few countries in Europe can rival Bulgaria's spa, balneological and wellness tourism, with its abundance and diversity of thermal mineral waters and curative mud deposits. There are more than 550 known sources with 1,600 hot springs. The hot spring with the highest temperature is Sapareva Banya (103°C). This is also the only geyser in Bulgaria and Continental Europe.

The country is known for excellent accommodation services and diverse programs that include massage, baths with mineral water, pearl baths, reflex therapy, medical exercises, balneological and medical cosmetics and many more.

Various tourism programmes combine these with visits of Bulgaria's cultural heritage, folkways, and traditional cuisine.

#### 10. URBAN WINE FEST PLOVDIV: A CELEBRATION OF LOCAL WINE CULTURE

October in Bulgaria is all about celebrating local wine and native grape varieties. For the past six years, 26 October has marked International Mavrud Day, honoring one of Bulgaria's most iconic grape sorts. This month offers opportunities to attend tastings at wine bars and shops, themed dinners across the country, online promotions, and masterclasses.

For the fourth year in a row, the Bulgarian Association of Wine Professionals (BAWP) leads the festivities with five Urban Wine Festivals in major cities. Among them is Urban Wine Fest Plovdiv, taking place **3–5 October 2025**, just ahead of the 9th UN Tourism Global Conference on Wine Tourism.

Set in Plovdiv's city center, the festival will feature wine bars, food stalls, caravans, and a vibrant music lineup. Guests are invited to taste over 40 wines made from 15 local grape varieties, available by the glass, bottle, or to-go.

In the spotlight this year is a dedicated regional stand, co-hosted by Plovdiv Wine Routes and BAWP, which will highlight wines from local producers and offer visitors a deeper dive into Plovdiv's unique terroir and styles.

The festival focuses on wines made from native and Bulgarian-developed varieties, such as Mavrud, Shiroka Melnik Vine, Red Misket, and cross-bred varieties like Rubin, Gergana, Kaylashki Misket, Melnik 55, and Sandanski Misket.

The event is held under the patronage of the Minister of Tourism, with official support from the Ministry of Tourism, the Ministry of Agriculture, Plovdiv Municipality, and Mastercard. It is included in the Plovdiv 2025 Cultural Calendar and is financially supported by the municipality's Annual Tourism Development Program.
