



#### **Africa traffic trends**








- Passenger traffic in Revenue Passenger-Kilometres (RPKs) increased by 36.6% in 2023.
- Passenger traffic in Africa has increased higher than the world average after the pandemic.


- Seat Capacity in Available Seat-Kilometres (ASKs) increased by 33.9% in 2023.
- Capacity in Africa has increased higher than the world average after the pandemic.
- Cargo traffic measures in Freight Tonnes-Kilometres (FTKs) increased by 2.3% in 2023.
- FTK YOY in Africa has increased higher than the world average after the pandemic.



## **Long-term Traffic Forecasts (Africa)**




 Passenger traffic (RPK) CAGR\* 2019-2050 forecast is 3.7%, 4.9% and 3.8% for international, domestic and total, respectively.



• Cargo traffic (FTK) CAGR 2019-2050 forecast is 3.2% for total.




