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Key findings (1)

World Tourism Barometer
January 2026

International arrivals grew 4% in 2025 to reach 1.5 billion

- An estimated 1.52 billion international tourist arrivals (overnight visitors) were recorded in 2025, a 4% increase, or almost 60 million more than in 2024.
- Results are in line with the January 2025 Barometer forecast of 3% to 5% growth and represent a normalization of growth rates after a four-year recovery from the pandemic.
- Travel demand remained solid throughout 2025 despite inflation and geopolitical tensions, though it softened towards the end of the year. International arrivals grew 3% in Q4 2025, after 4% in Q3, which corresponds to the Northern Hemisphere summer season.
- Europe, the world's largest destination region, recorded 793 million international tourists in 2025, a 4% increase from 2024 and 6% more than in pre-pandemic year 2019.
- The Americas saw 1% more arrivals last year, with mixed results across subregions and small declines in Q3 and Q4 2025, partly due to weak results in the United States.
- Africa recorded 8% growth in 2025 led by results in North Africa (+11%), while arrivals in the Middle East grew 3%, exceeding pre-pandemic levels by 39%, the strongest results relative to 2019.
- Asia and the Pacific saw an 6% increase in 2025, but arrivals remained 9% below 2019 levels, as the region continued to rebound.



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Key findings (2)

World Tourism Barometer
January 2026

Export revenues from tourism estimated at USD 2.2 trillion in 2025

- International tourism receipts are estimated at USD 1.9 trillion in 2025, based on available monthly data. This represents a 5% to 6% increase from 2024, in real terms (preliminary).
- Many destinations reported higher growth in receipts than in arrivals, reflecting an increase in average spending per trip by international visitors.
- Total export revenues from tourism (including receipts and passenger transport) are estimated at USD 2.2 trillion in 2025.
- Tourism-related inflation eased to 5% in 2025, according to revised estimates, down from 8% in 2024, but still above 4% headline inflation.
- International arrivals are projected to grow 3% to 4% in 2026, assuming global economic conditions remain favourable, inflation continues to decline, and geopolitical conflicts do not escalate.
- 58% of the UN Tourism Panel of Experts foresee better or much better tourism results in 2026, while 31% expect similar results and 11% believe they will be worse.



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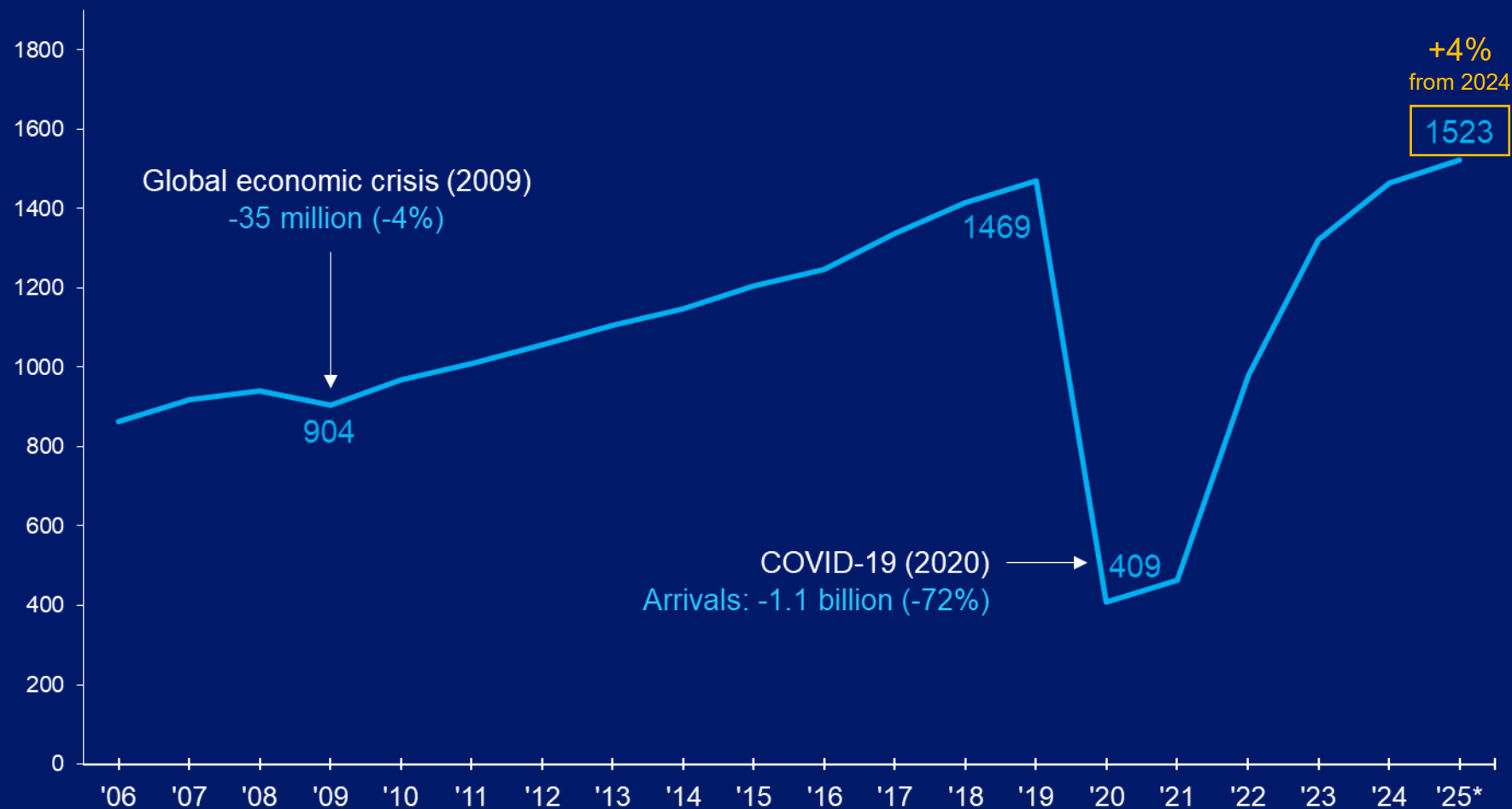
International tourist arrivals

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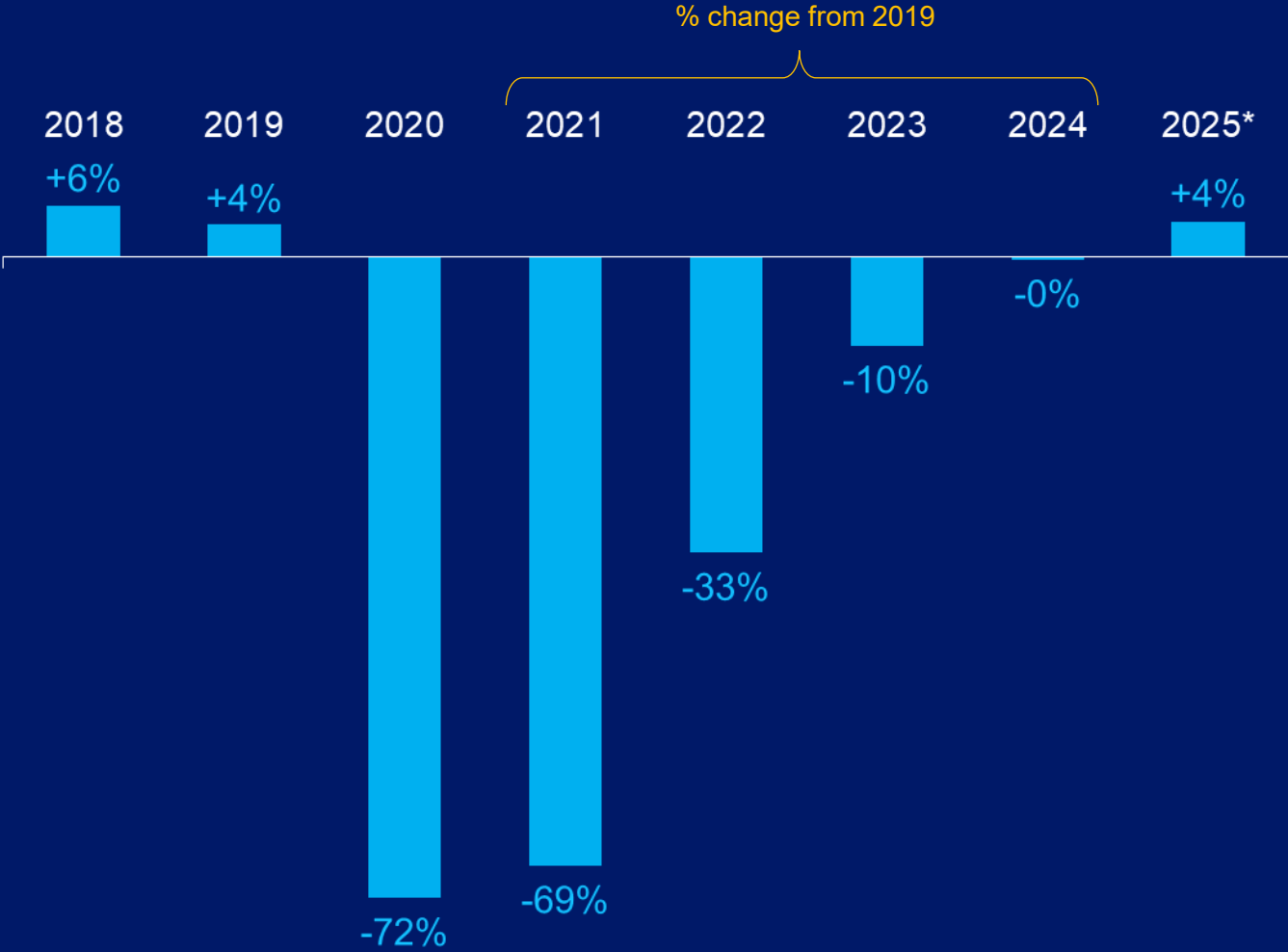
International tourist arrivals

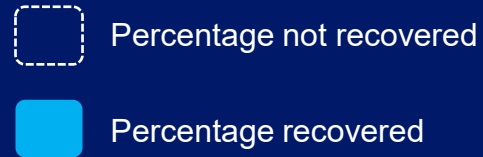

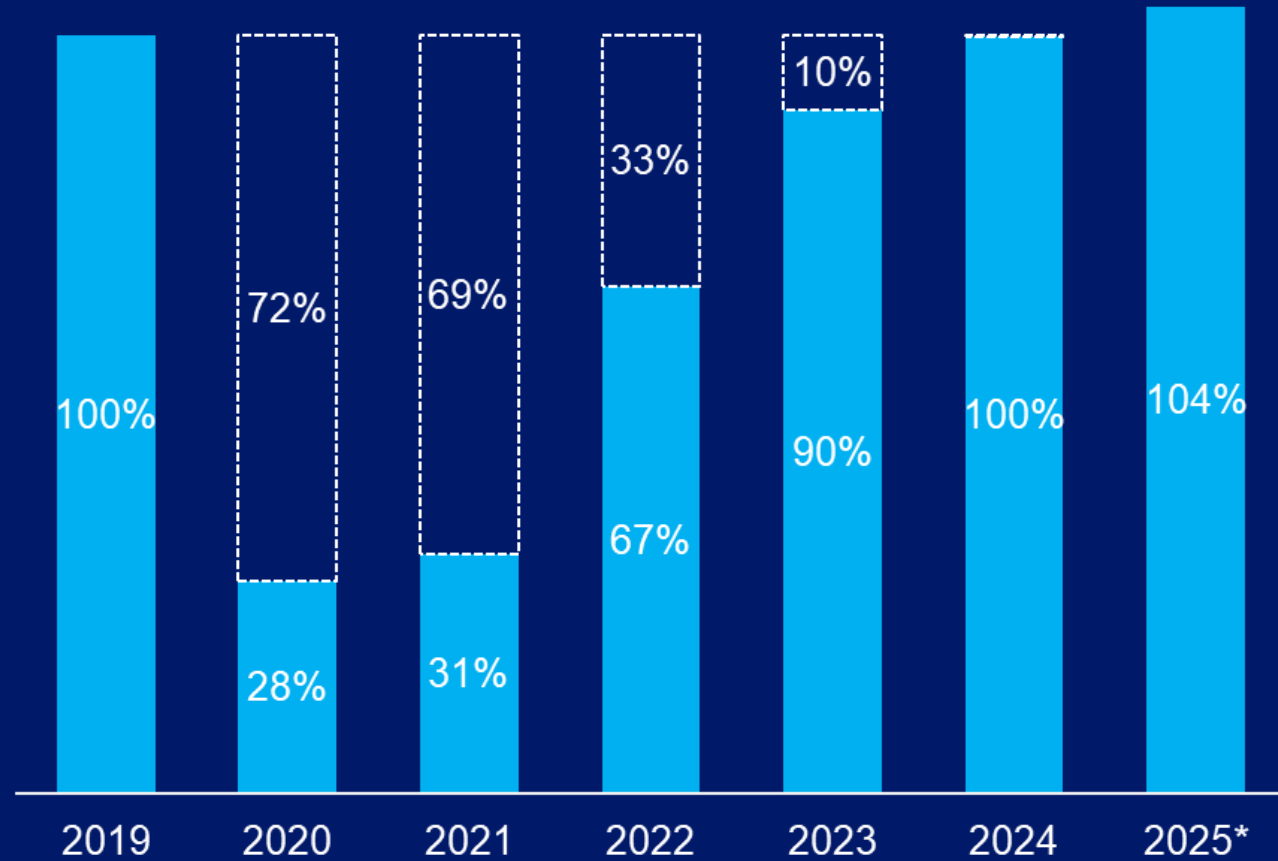
Recovery of international tourist arrivals

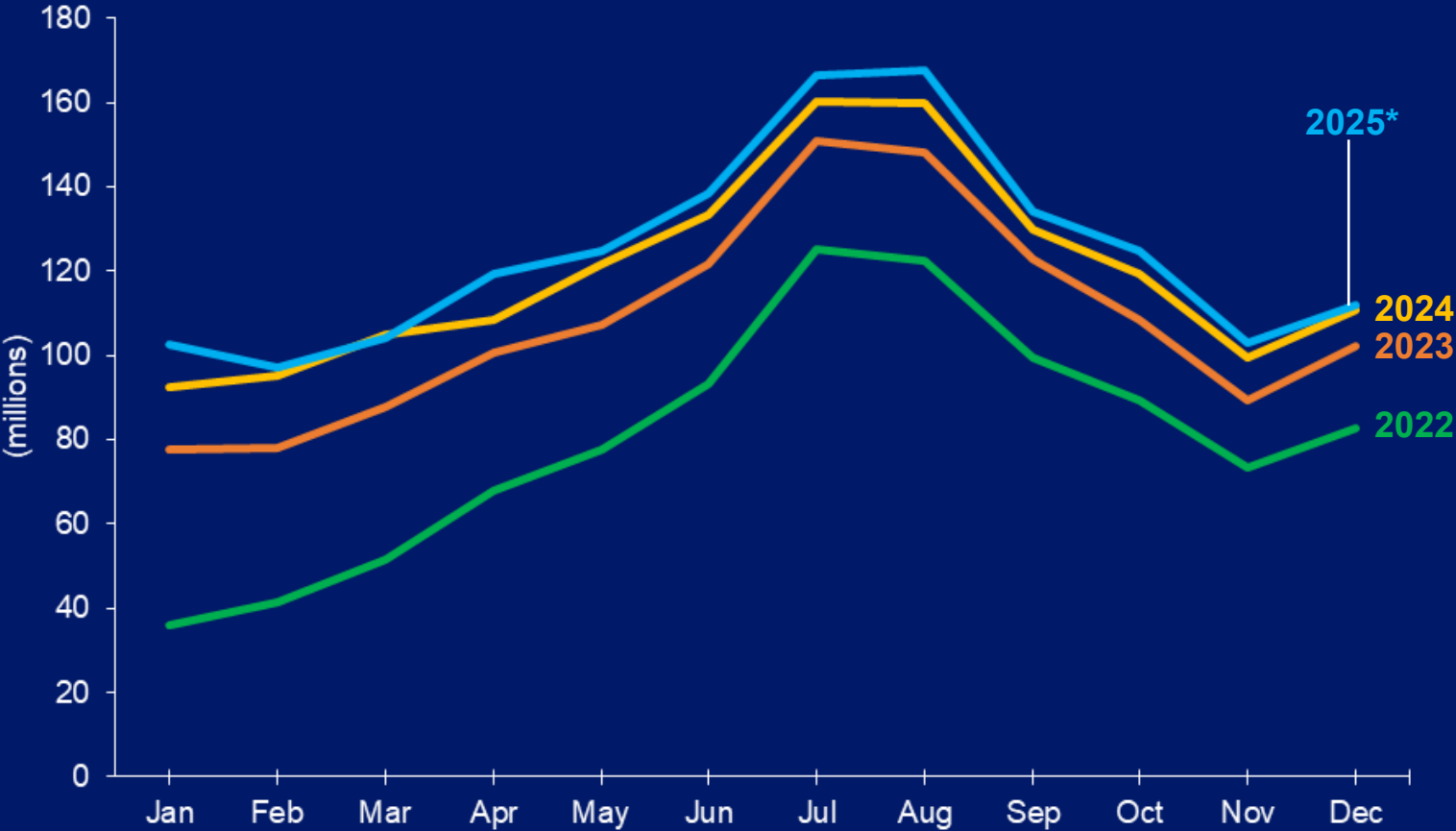

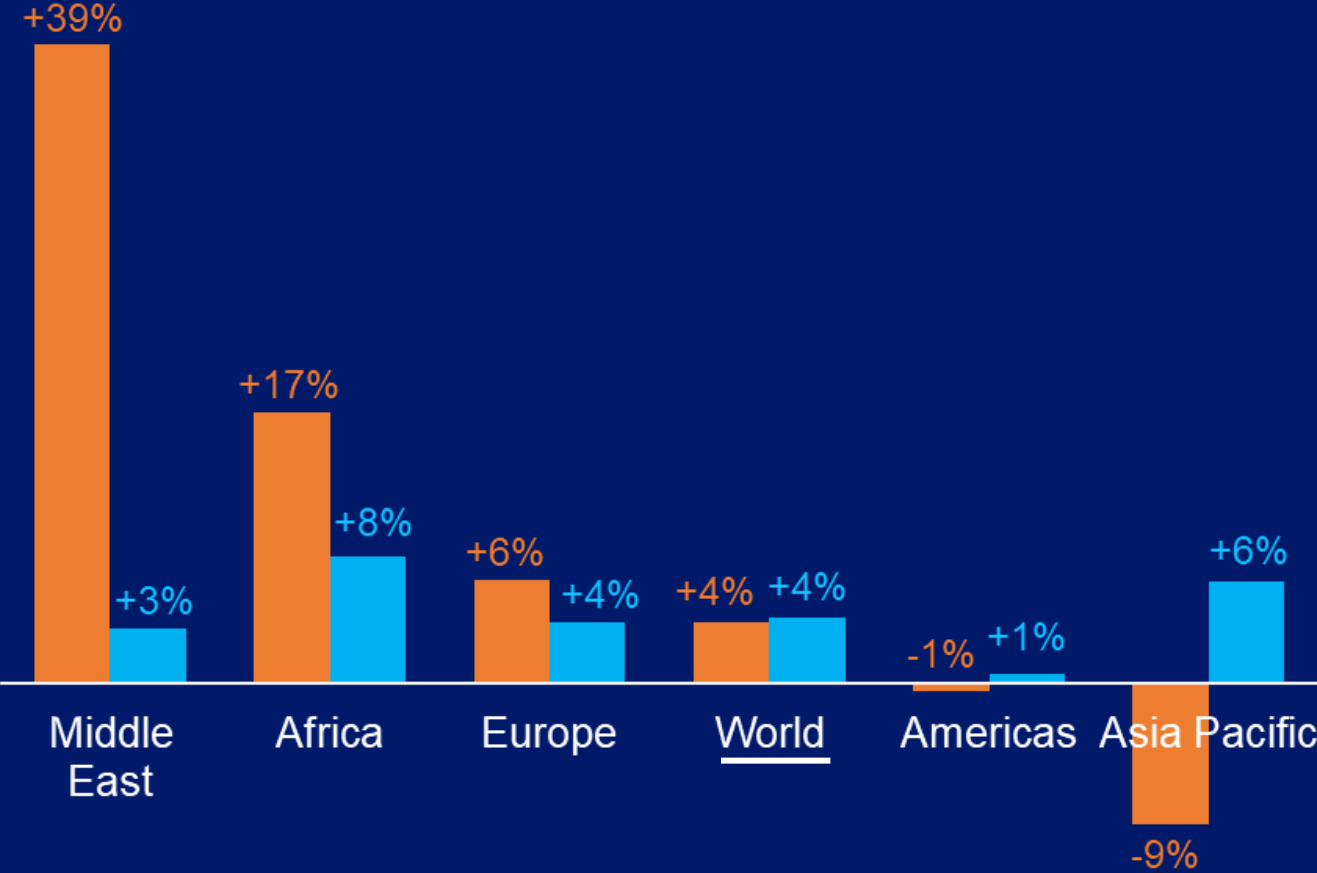


International tourist arrivals by region, 2025*

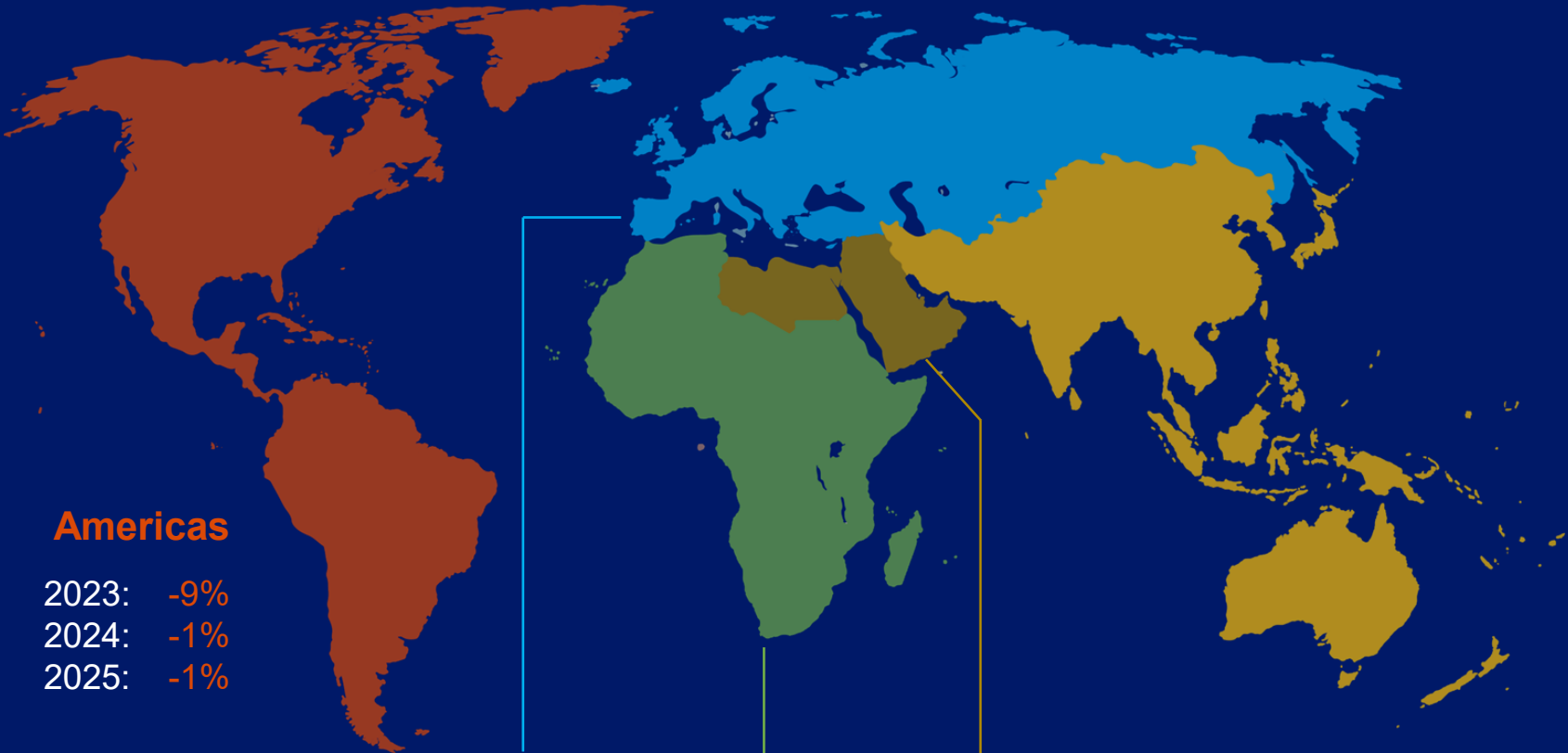

International arrivals by world region, 2025*

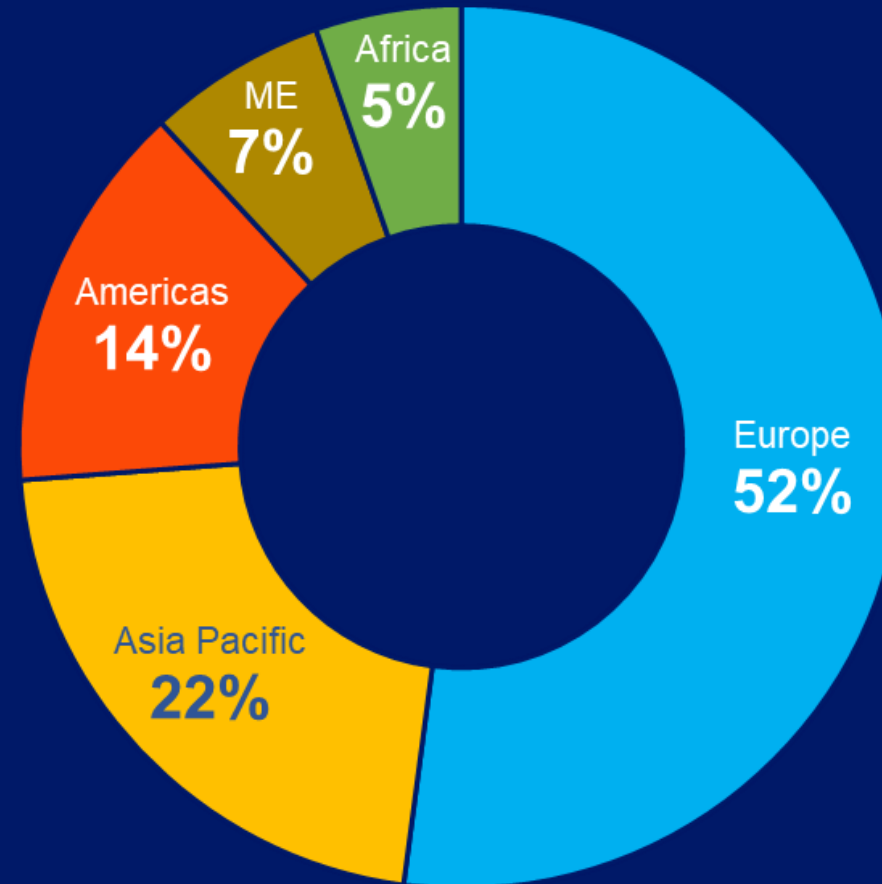

Receipts (USD billions)

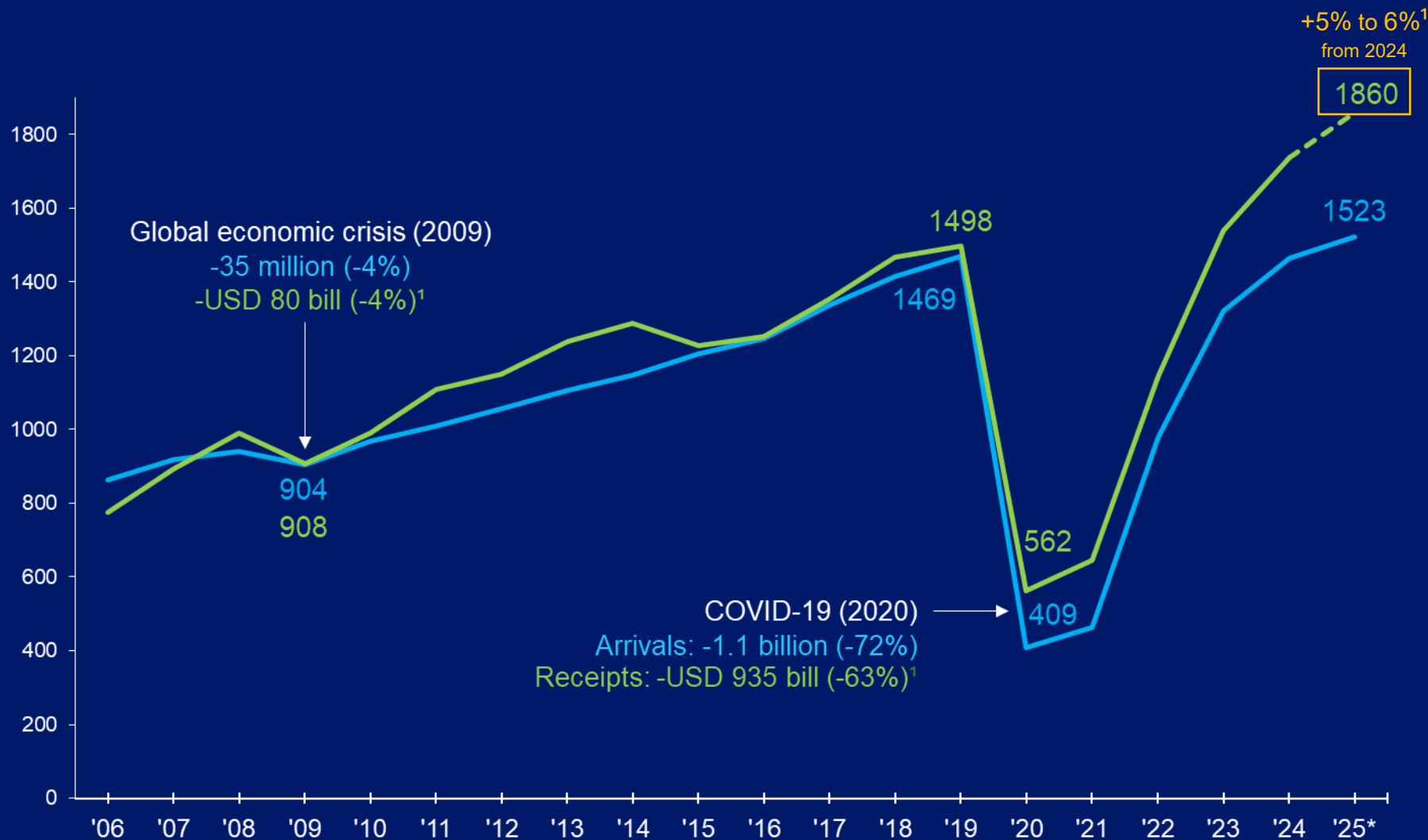

% change vs. 2024

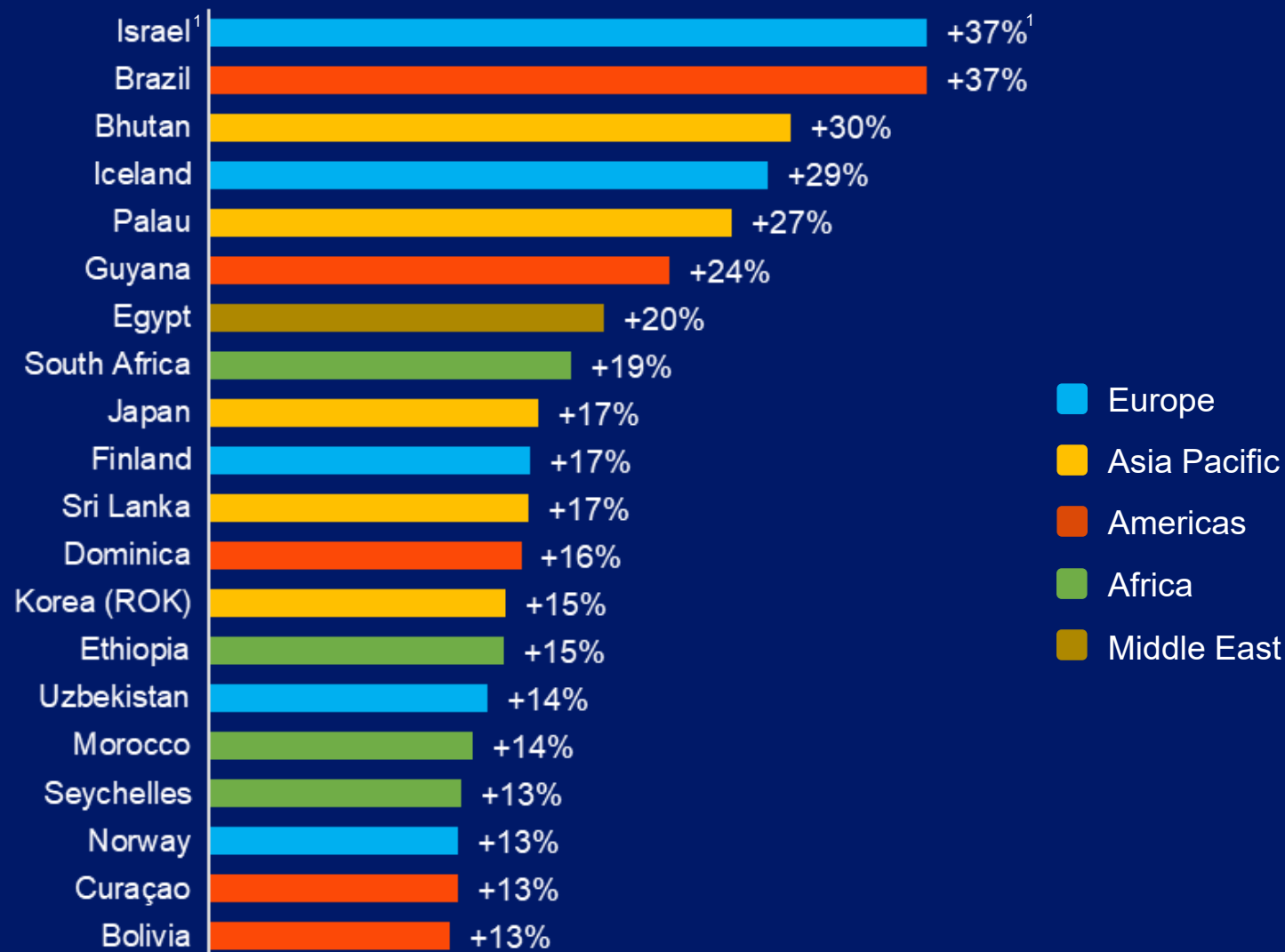

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Top 20 best-performing destinations in Jan-Dec 2025*

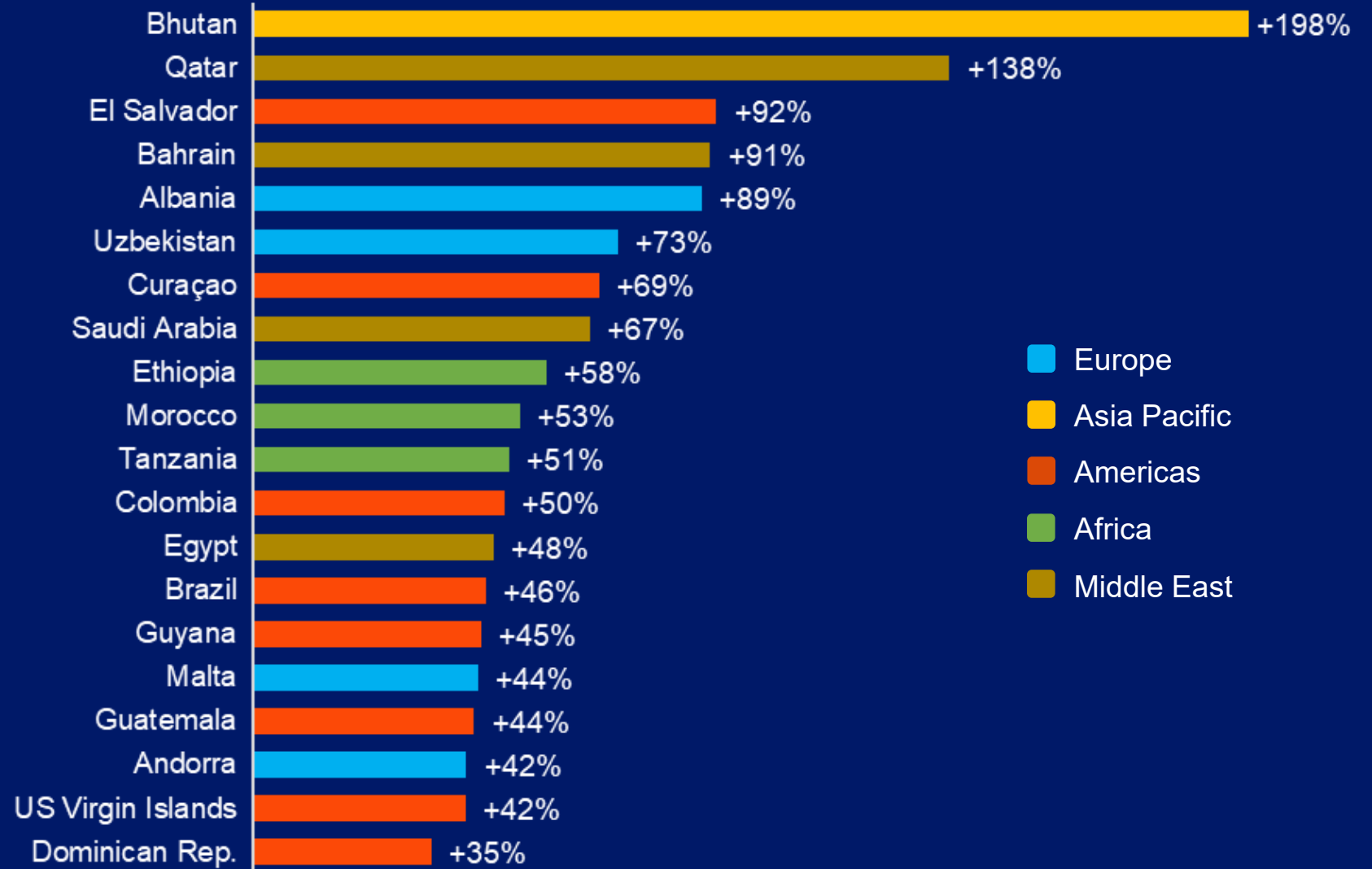

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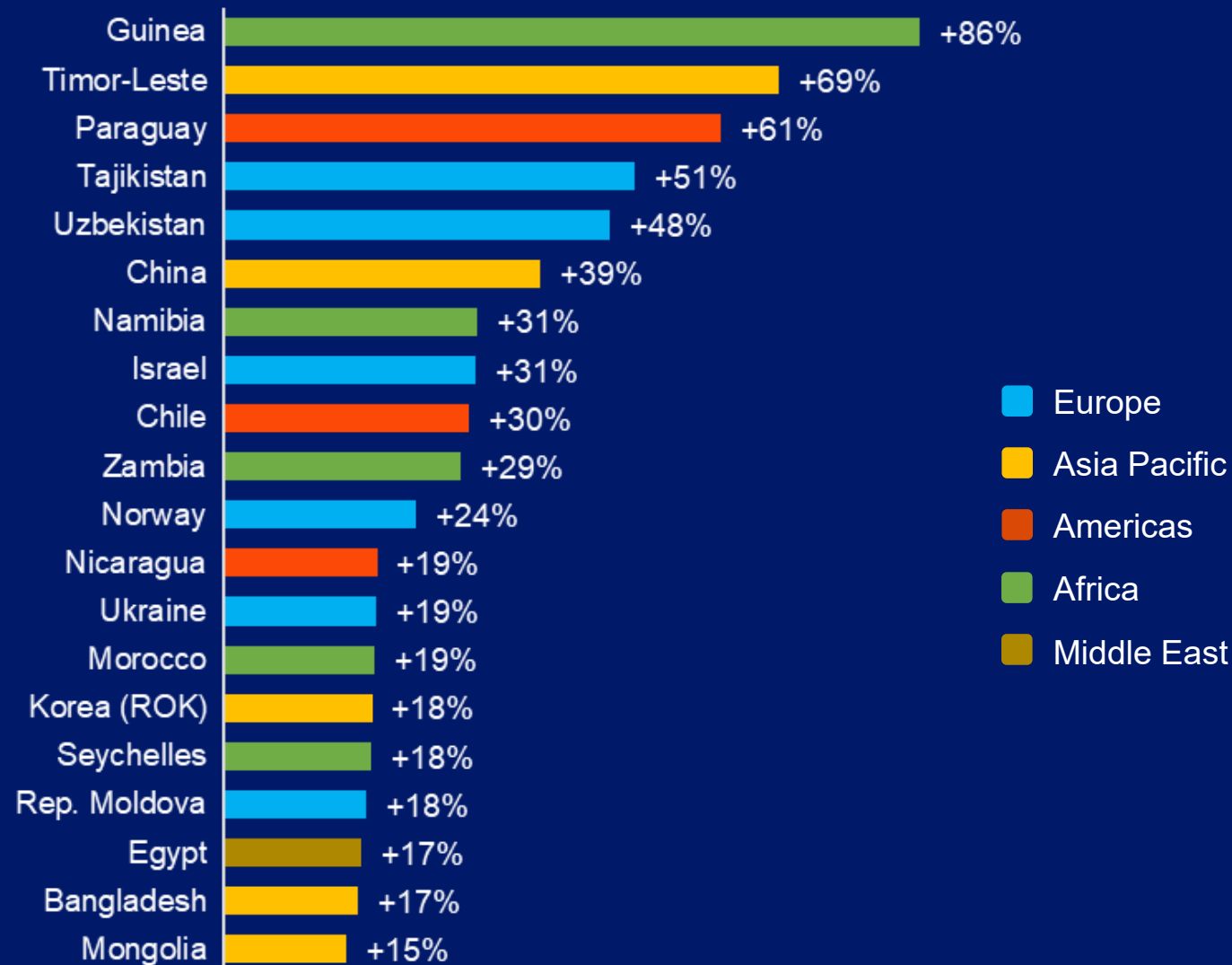
Top 20 best-performing destinations in earnings Jan-Nov 2025*

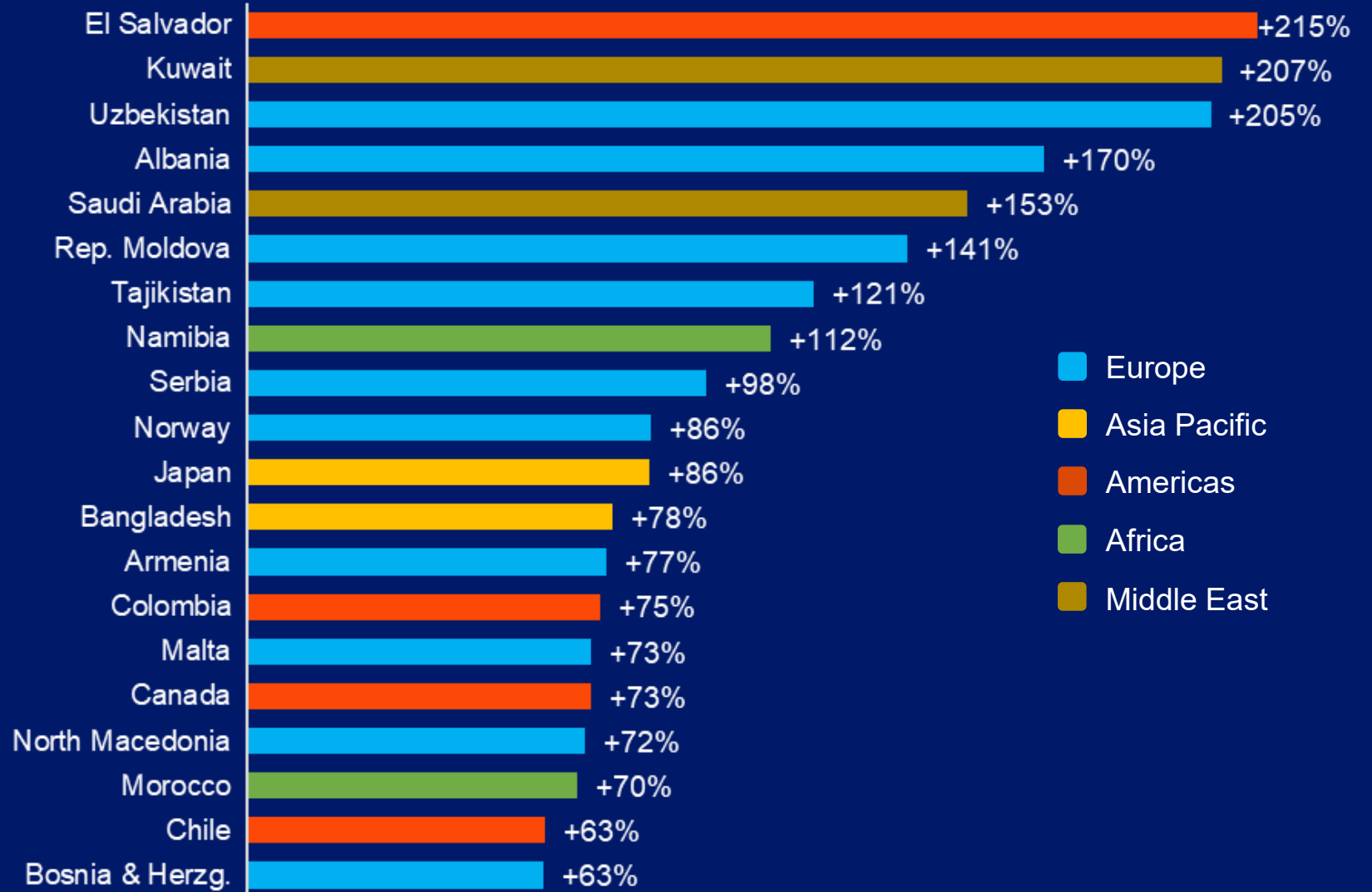

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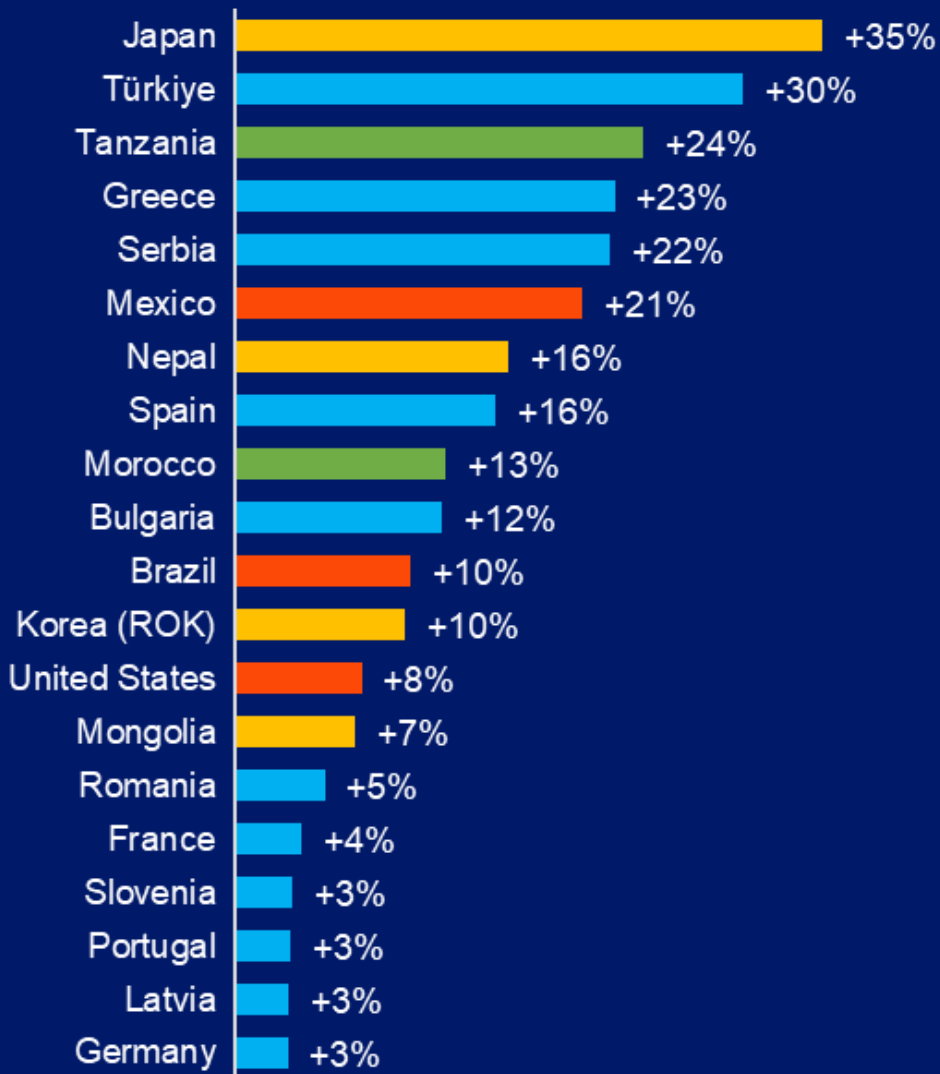
Top 20 best-performing markets by spending Jan-Nov 2025*

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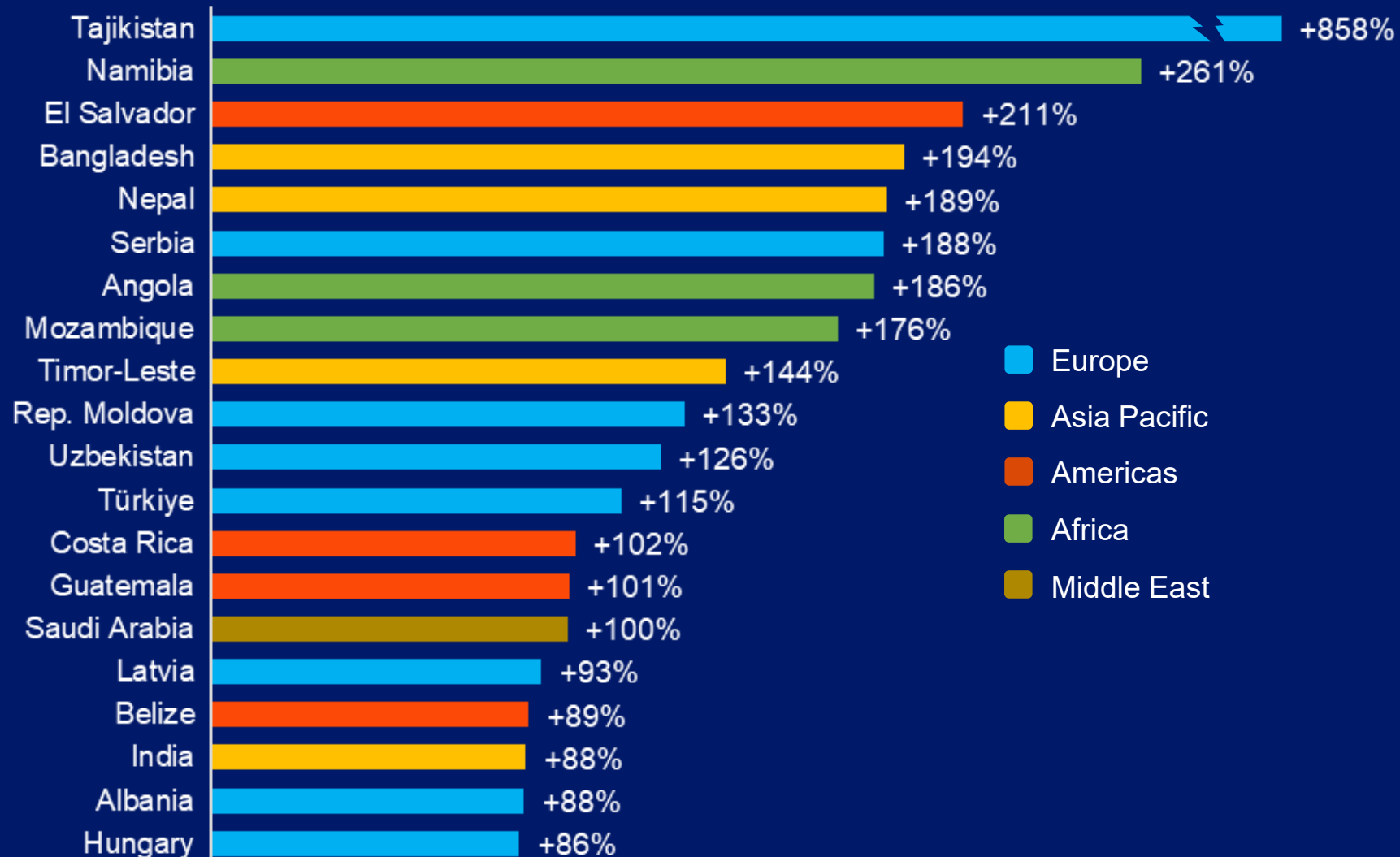
Top 20 best-performing markets by spending Jan-Nov 2025*

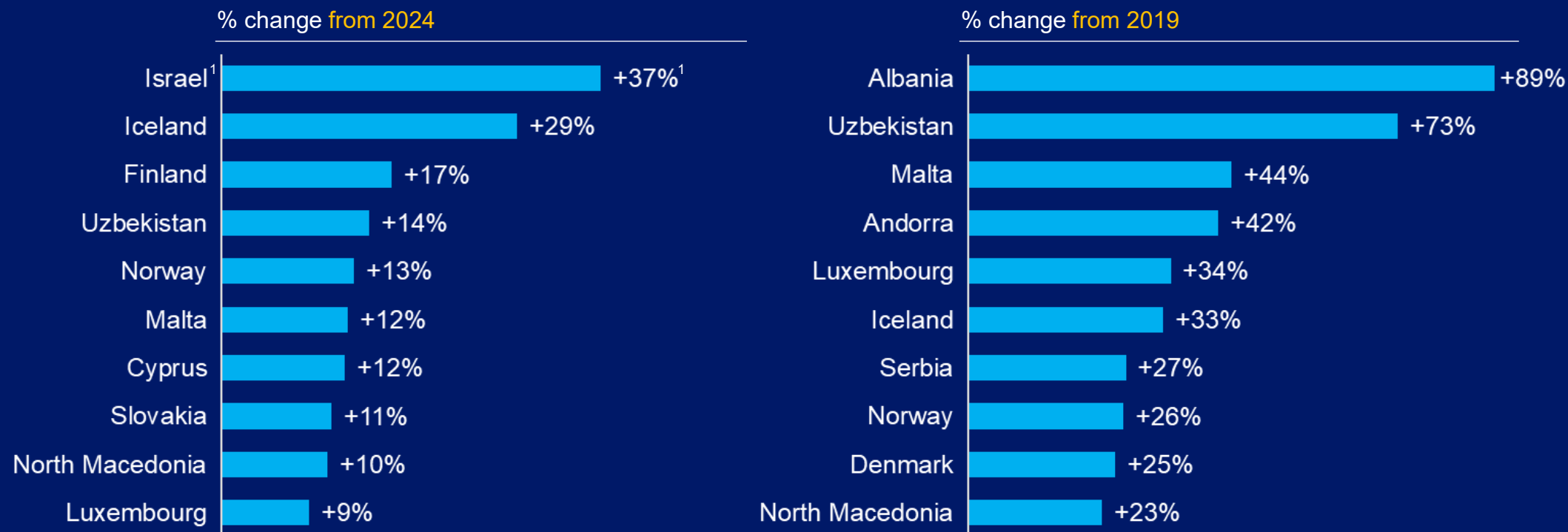

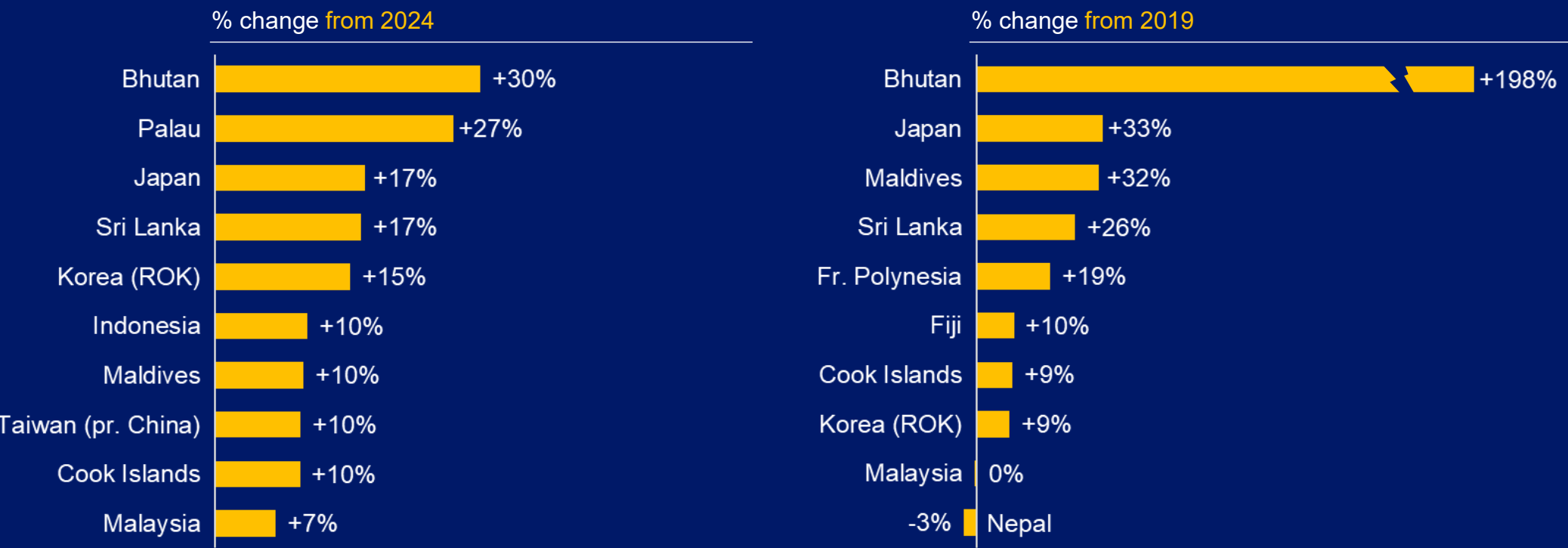

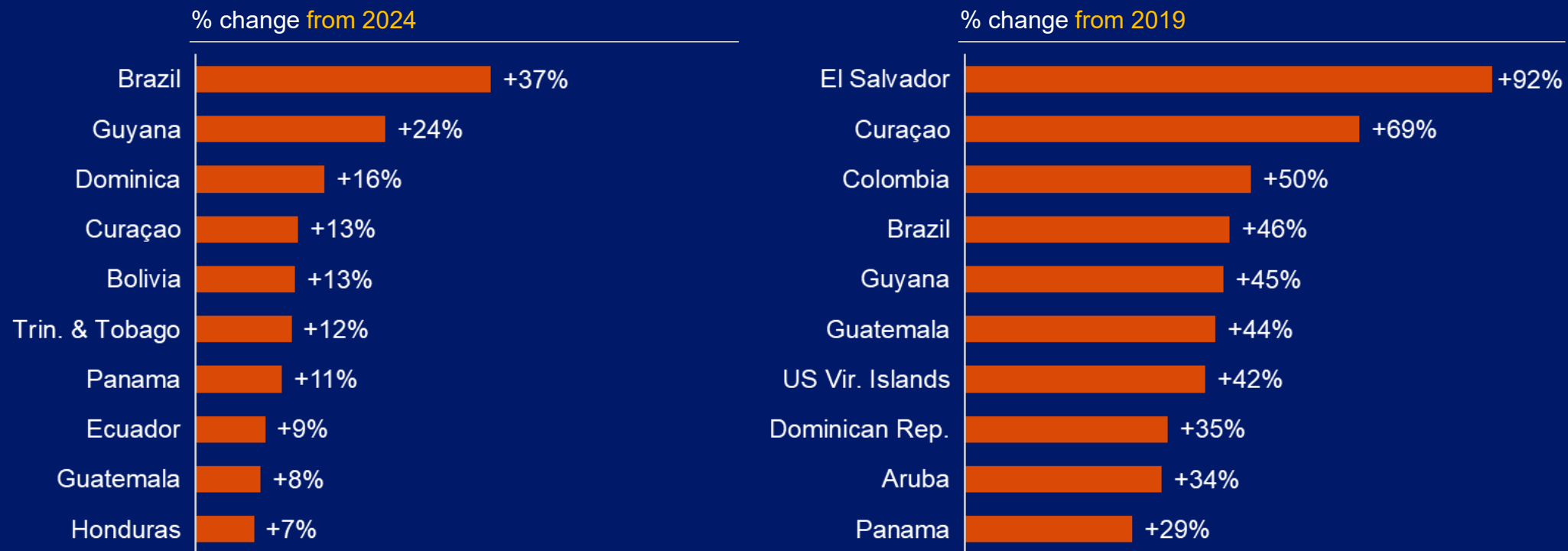

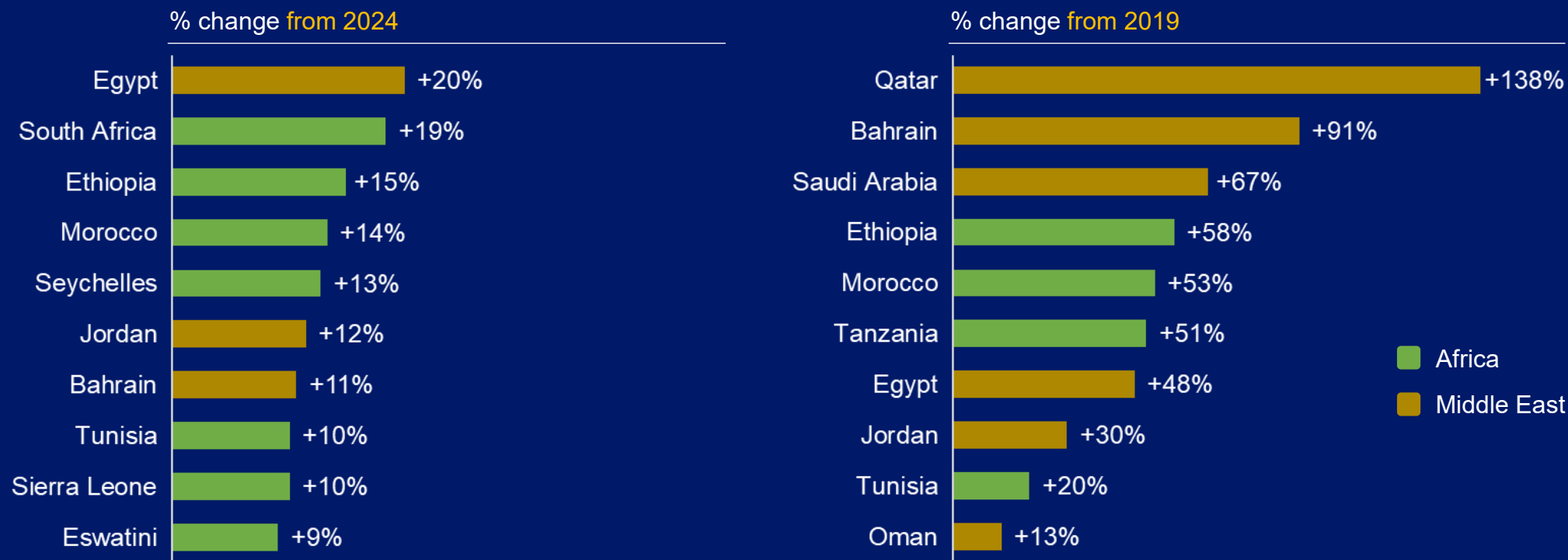

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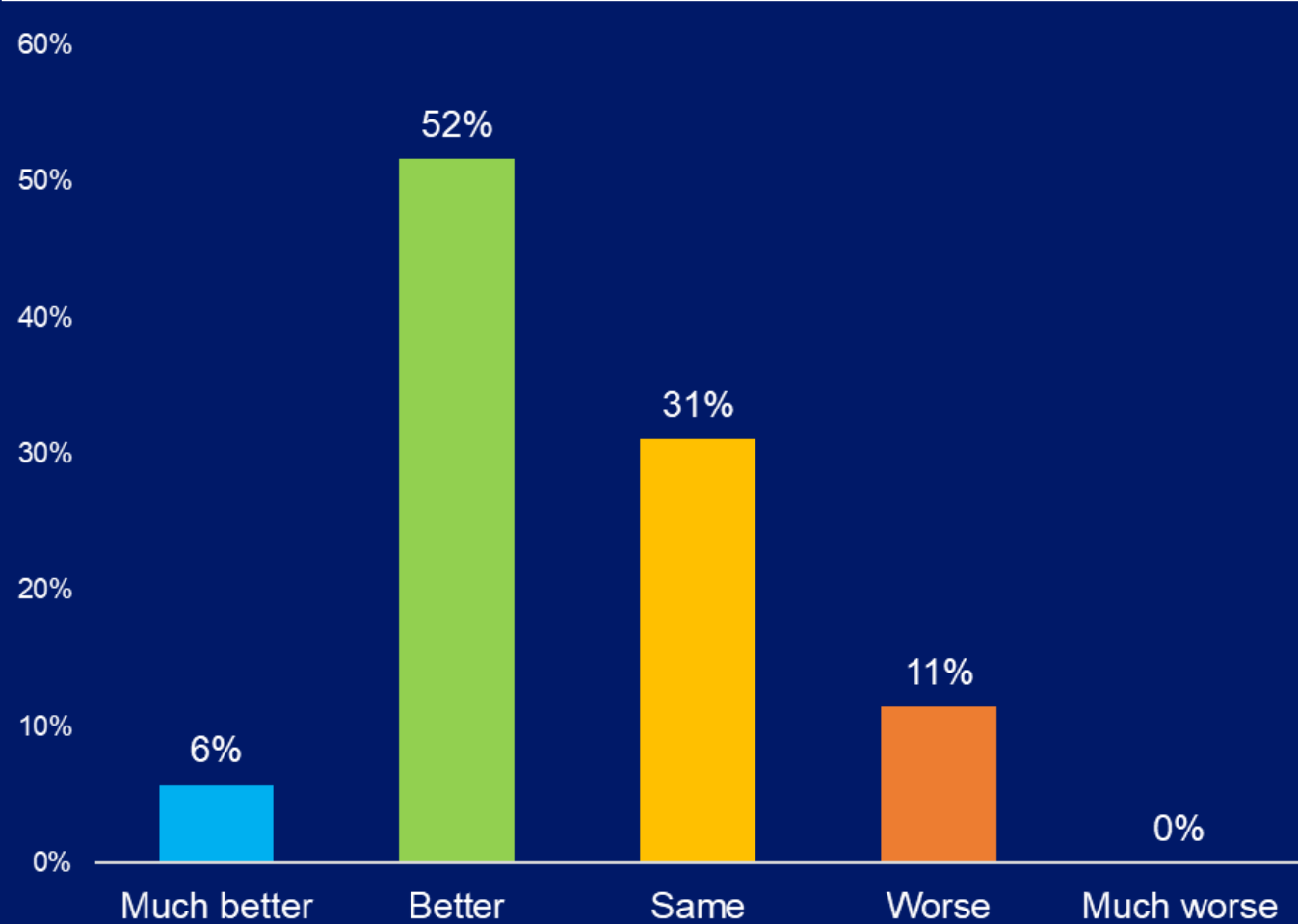

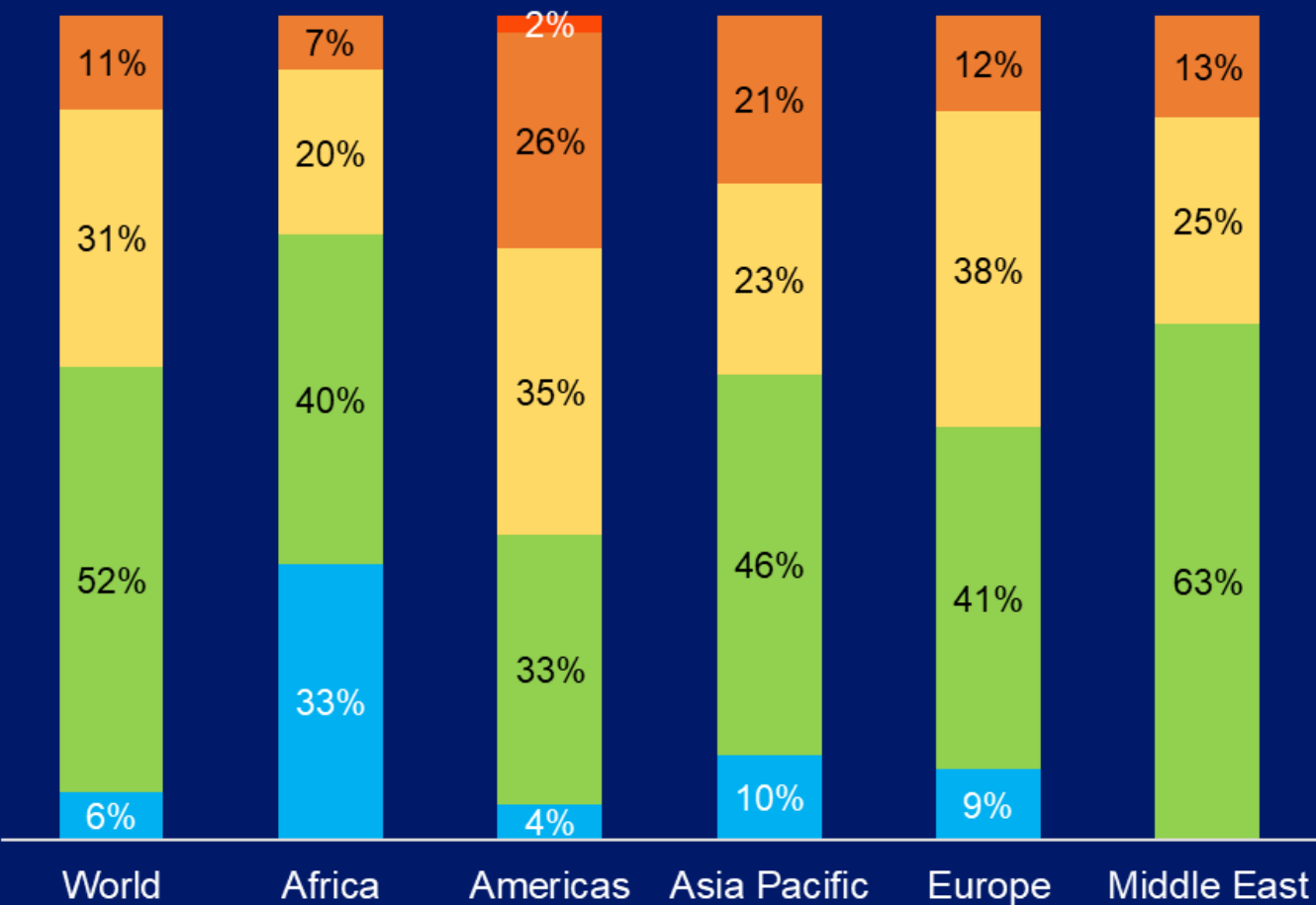

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Percentage of responses by world region

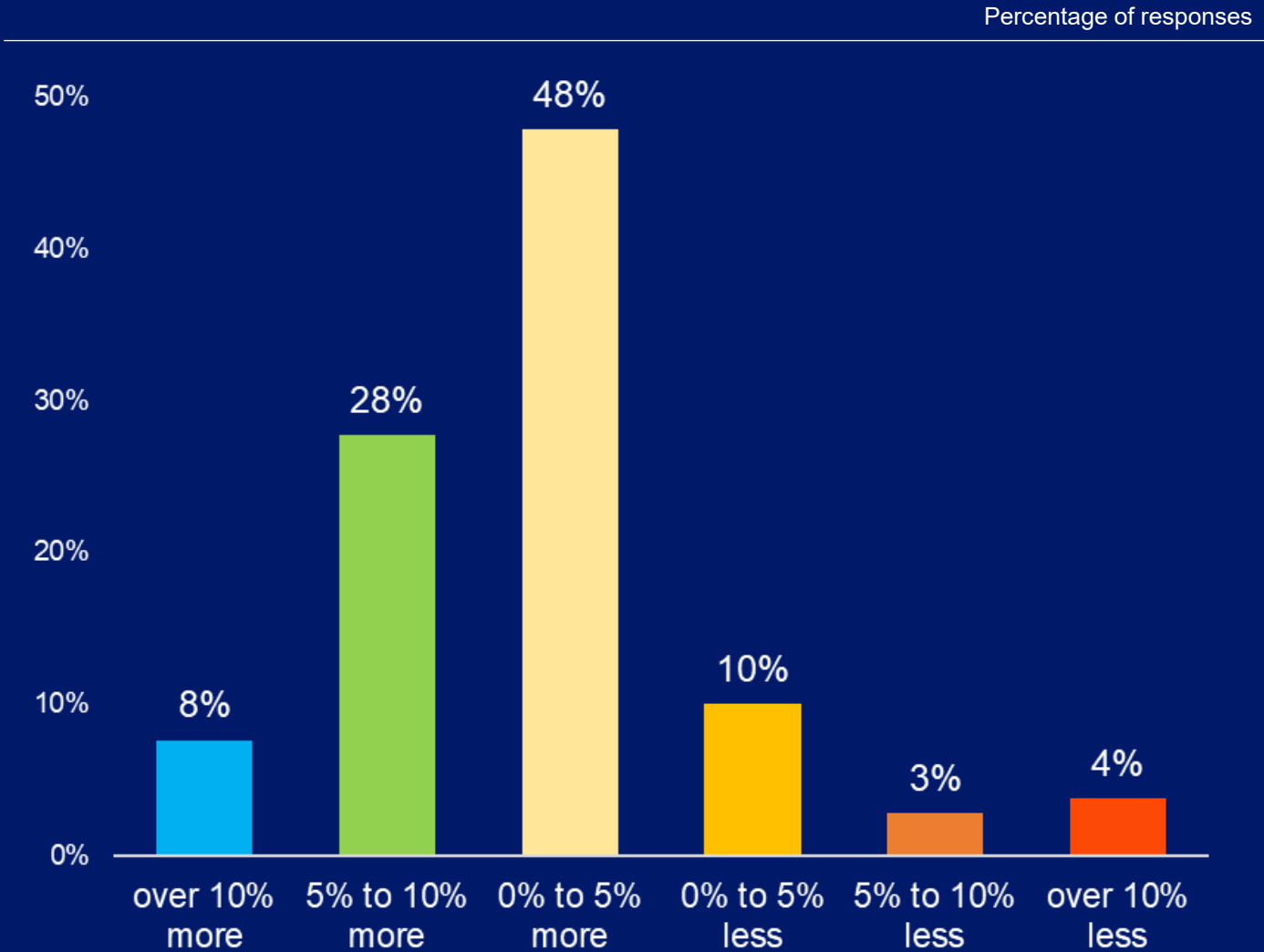


What levels of international tourist arrivals do you expect in your destination in 2026 (versus 2025)?

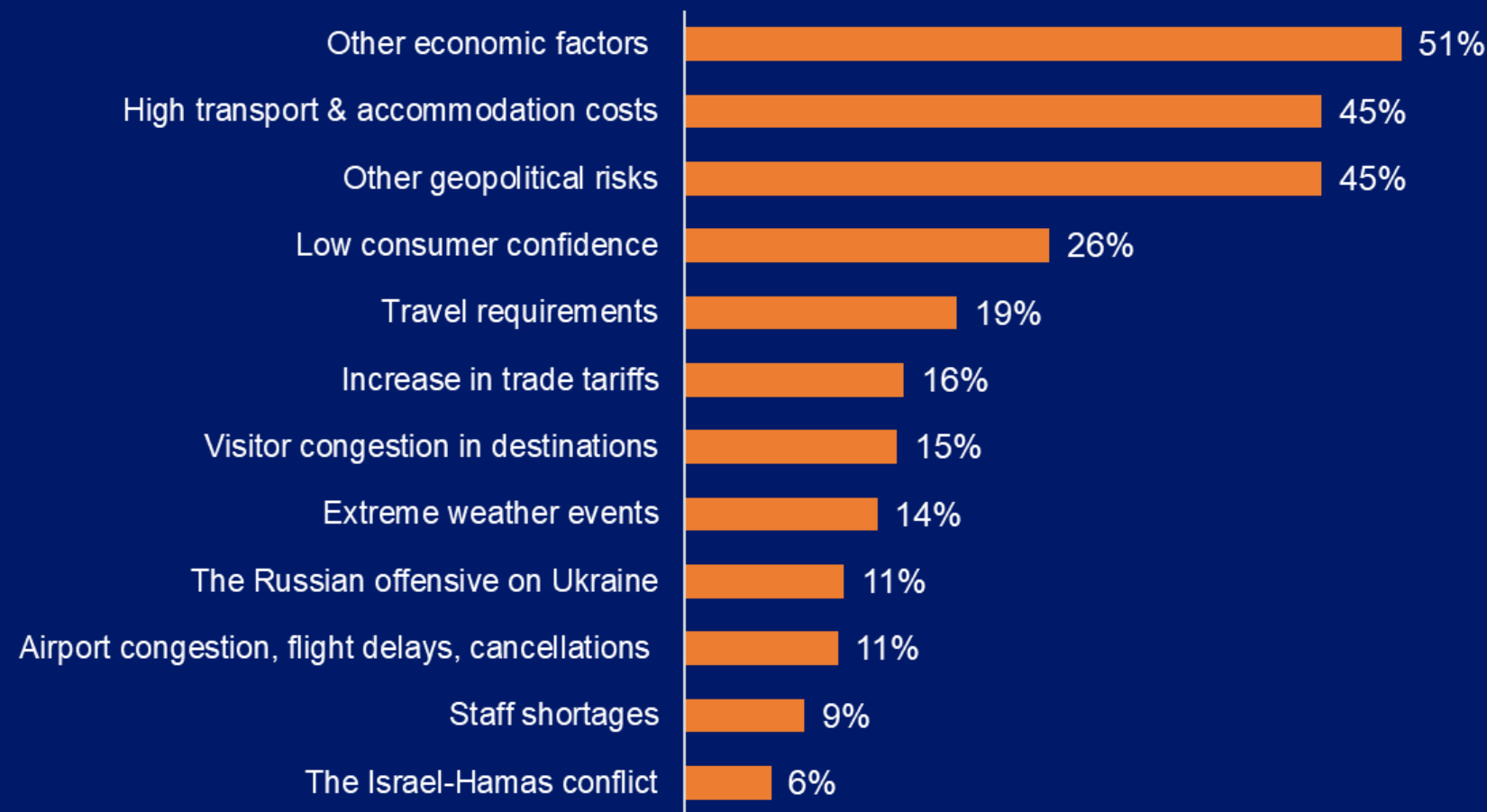
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What are the main challenges that international tourism will face in 2026?

Percentage of experts mentioning each factor



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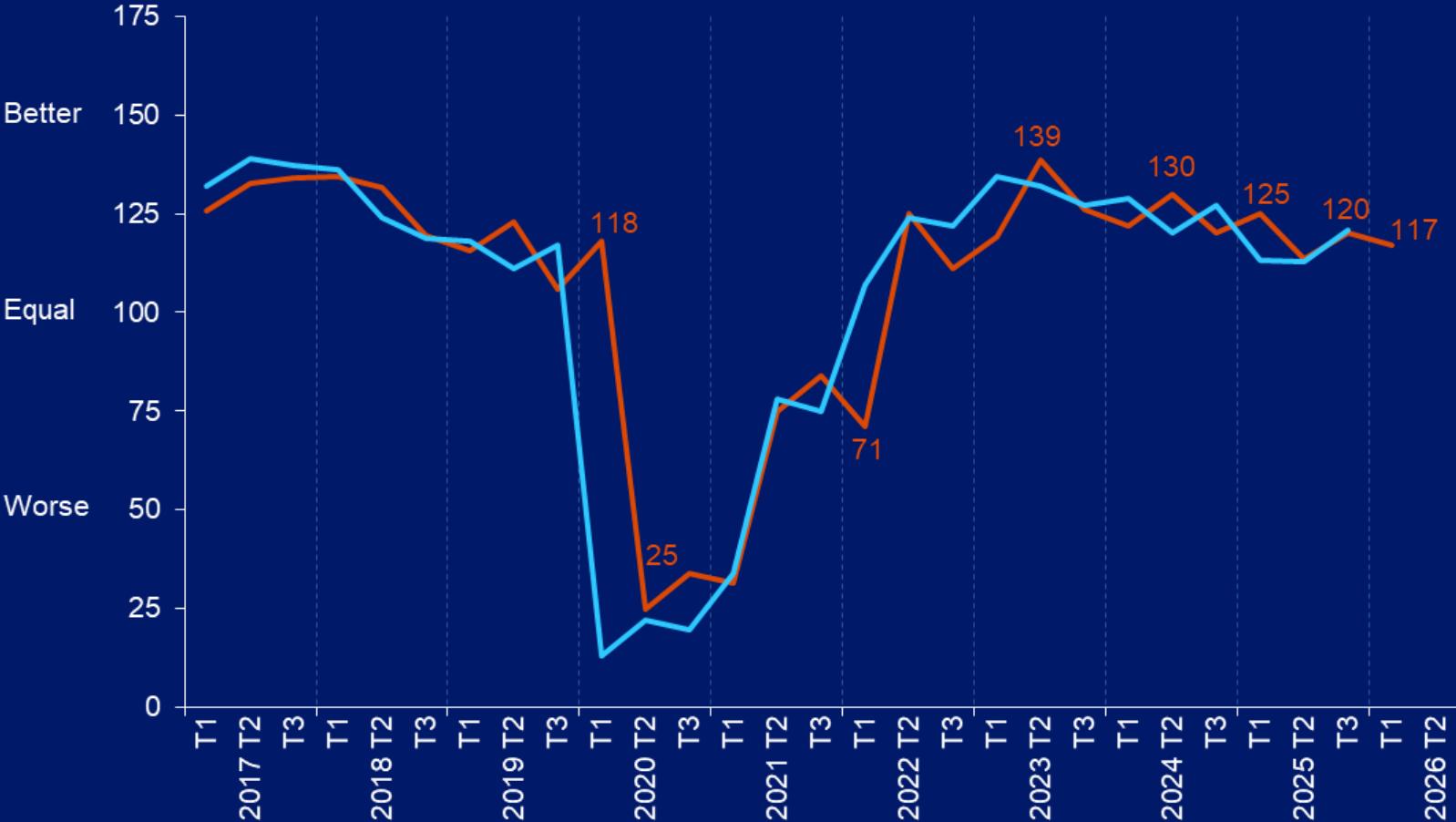

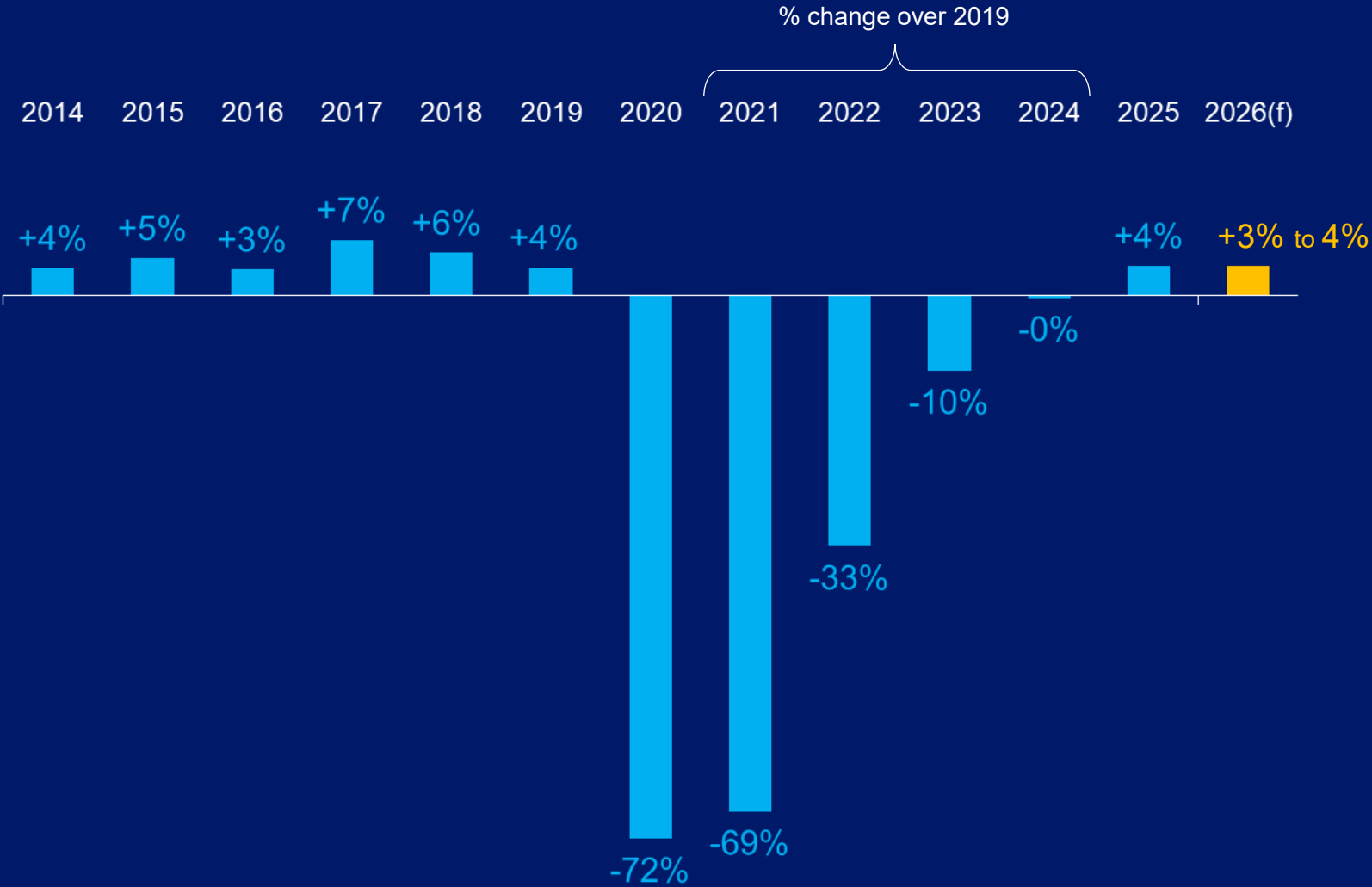

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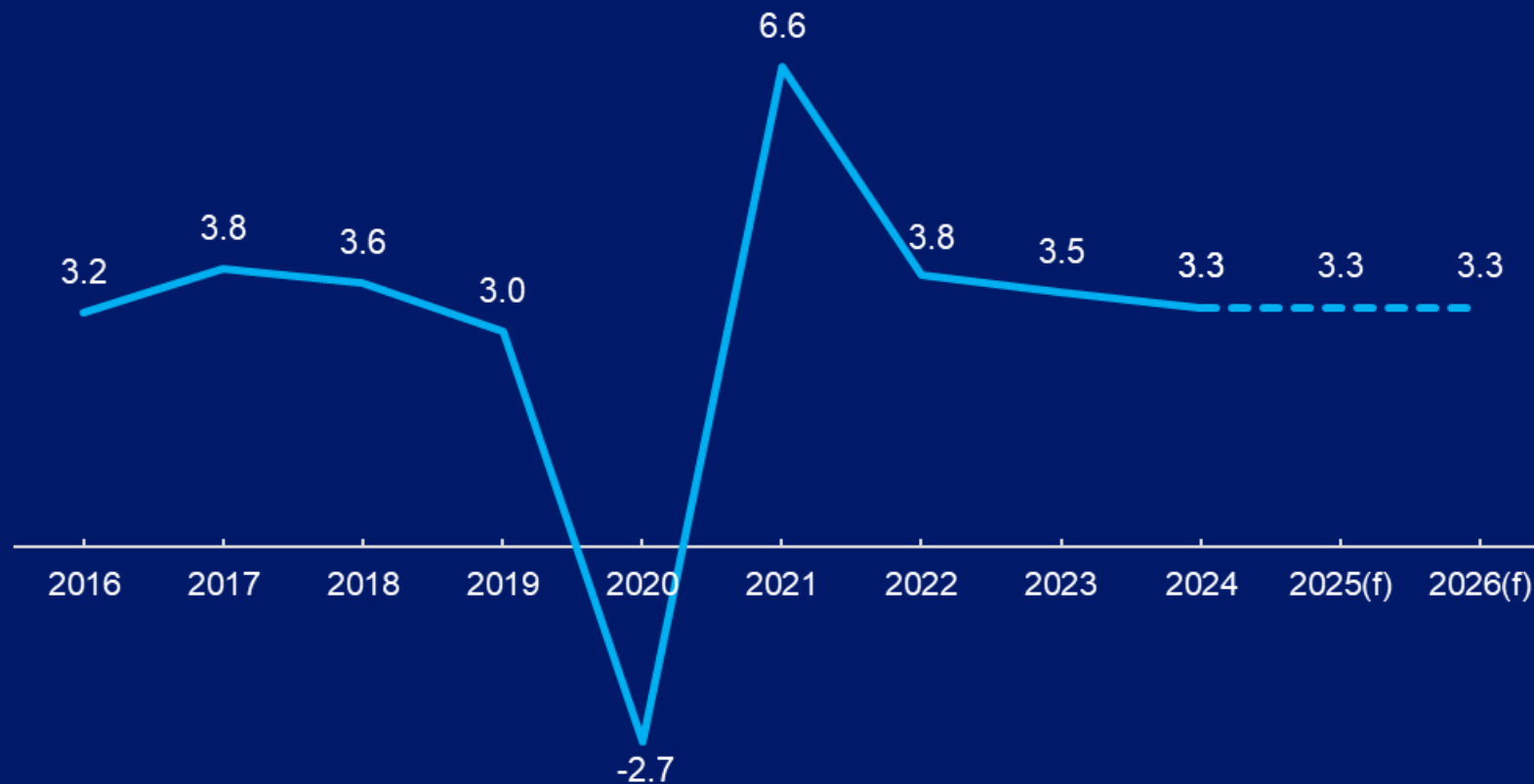
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World GDP (constant prices)

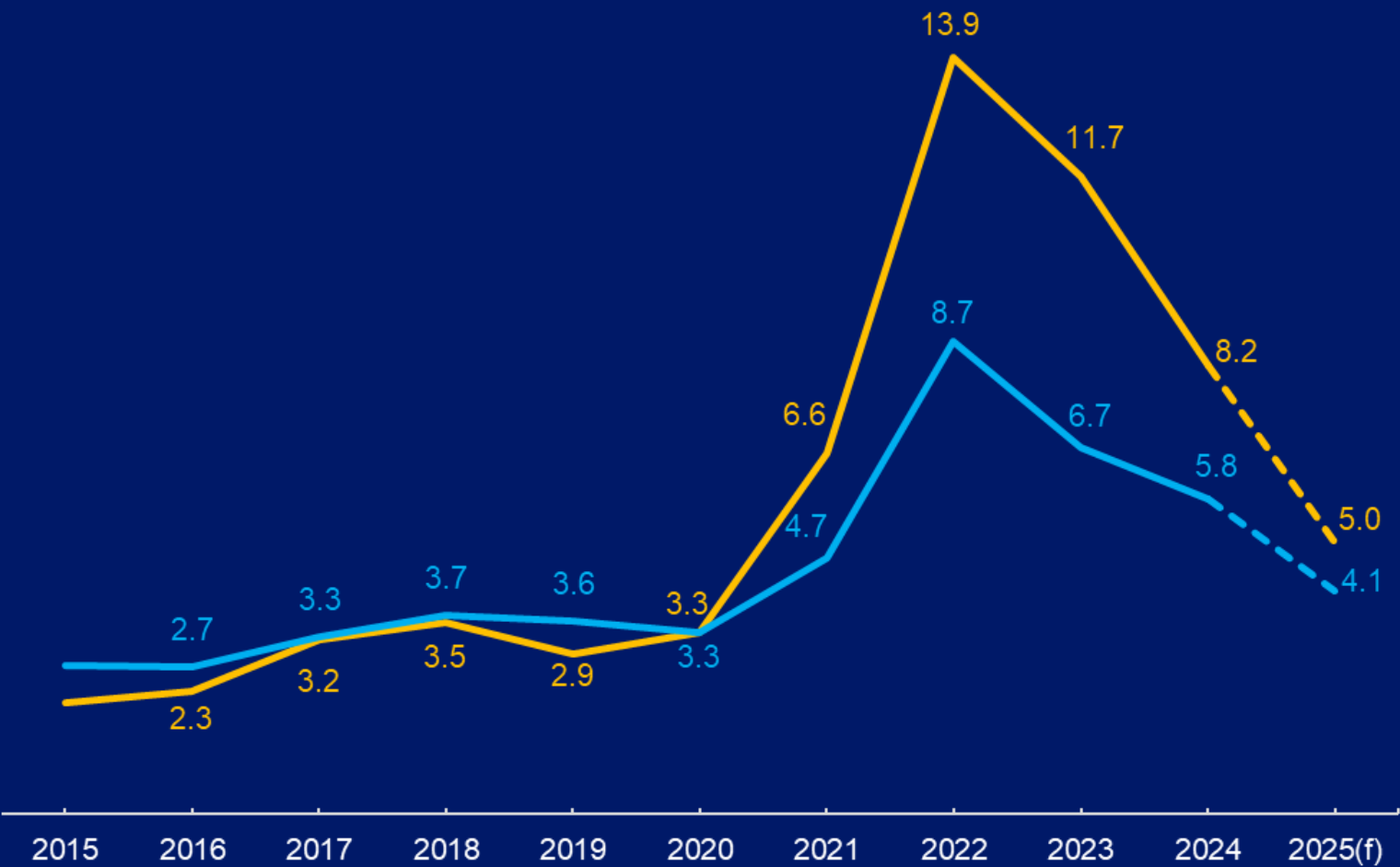
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Global tourism inflation vs. headline inflation
